## Reception

This week we learnt about blending sounds together to make a word (e.g. 'r' 'a' 't' = rat). We also developed our fine motor skills during our Funk Finger exercises. At home, please play 'I spy' with your child e.g. 'I spy with my little eye something that goes 'h - a - t'. This will help our blending skills.

## Year 3

We have been engineers this week. We explored and trialled different levers to help us prepare for designing and making our own shadow puppets next week! At home, encourage your child to practise their times tables and read with them as much as possible. Try logging on to Times Table Rockstars!

## Year 1

We had a special visit from the Avon and Rescue fire station. We learnt how to stop, drop and roll! The children also learnt how to write a story this week. Read with your child every day for 10 minutes. Practise comparing numbers with the words; more than, less than and equal to. Check they are writing letters the right way round.

## Year 4

As Authors, we wrote our own versions of the class story called 'Frogspell'. As Mathematicians, we rounded numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. Year 4 enjoyed their skipping workshops this week and are loving using the skipping ropes at play times and lunch times. Coding is another one of Year 4's favourite lessons at the moment! . At home, practise how to round 4 digit numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

## Year 2

We made the delicious meals we had designed and really enjoyed eating them. We began planning our instructions so we can share our recipes with everyone else. As mathematicians we have looked at adding two 2 digit numbers. At home, read with your child every day for 10 minutes. Practise counting forwards and backwards from 100 and adding and subtracting within 100.

## Year 5

As Authors, we have been exploring explanation texts and the features of these. As Mathematicians we have used our knowledge of column method to add and subtract numbers with up to 6 digits. This week we have also been artists and, inspired by Megan Coyle, have made our own Bristol inspired collages. . At home, practise times tables up to 12 x 12.

## YEAR 6

As authors, Kestrel Class looked at different sentence types and used subordinating and coordinating conjunctions. We also explored facts and opinions and vocabulary as readers. In maths we learned to use the formal written method of long division. Meanwhile, Eagle Class have spent the week at IntoUniversity, had a trip to the zoo and a special Graduation on Friday! At home, please read with your child for 15 minutes daily and encourage your children to use Times Table Rockstars.
