






### **Community Room extension**

# Reception

This week we practised for our Nativity play! We learnt lots of songs and we learnt what our characters say and do. We are really excited to perform for you all. Please come and watch on Wednesday 18th at 2pm! At home, please help your child learn their lines and practise the songs for the performance!!



This week as mathematicians we did some tests to see how much we've learnt so far – the children have impressed us! As writers we wrote a non-chronological report all about what is under our feet. You'll be able to see these at our showcase next week.

At home read with your child as often as possible and encourage them to practice their 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

## Year 5

This week we practised our performance of Oliver. The show is next week on Thursday at 2pm — please come along and see it, along with a gallery of our art work from this term. As mathematicians, we continued to practise written method for multiplication. We also wrote a play script for our novel 'Street Child'.

At home, please practise times tables facts eg. 2 x  $6 = 12 \dots 12 \div 6 = 2$ . And, practise your lines for Oliver.



This week we learnt how to add numbers. In English and Enquiry we made our own hats and started to write our own instructions.

At home, please read with your child every day for 10 minutes. Practise describing numbers with tens and ones. Ask your child about the hat they have made.

#### Year 2

This week Year 2 wrote their own nonfiction book about Brunel and all of his achievements. We also learnt all about gathering data and graphs in mathematics.

At home, please learn the 2, 5 and 10 times tables using Times Table Rockstars. Read every day at home.



Year 4 have been superb scientists all week!
We discovered a number of things about sound through a series of practical investigations, including: pitch variations, volume and how sound waves travel through different mediums.
At home, please practise writing compound and complex sentences.



We learnt all about the gruesome processes of the Ancient Egyptians and Greeks and compared these to our own. We also learnt how to use the four operations with fractions and wrote an explanation text. Eagle class also finally went to UnitDX!

At home, please ask your child what they learnt at UnitDX this week (Eagle) or last week (Kestrel).
