What have we been learning?

Year 1

This week Year 1 wrote all about our likes and dislikes. We continued to read our story 'Dogs don't do Ballet' and explored our different facial features using adjectives. As mathematicians we also practised writing numbers 1-10 correctly. At home, please read with your child and practise writing numbers 1-10.

Year 2

This week Year 2 practised their friendship song and made a friendship fruit salad for the garden party. We explored our book Beegu and the children wrote fantastic diary entries. We also recapped our addition and subtraction skills. At home, help your child by practising counting forwards and backwards from 1-50.

Year 3

We continued to read the story of Grace and Family to support our discussions about our families. We learnt about family trees and made our own in art. We recapped our learning about place value, addition and subtraction ready to start our new maths learning next week. Please support your child with their homework over the weekend and make sure they bring it in on Monday.

Year 5

What a great week! We created a rap and made cakes for our community event, had our first swimming lesson and also had a great PE lesson. We wrote fantastic diaries and gave advice about a dilemma as part of our work as authors. As mathematicians, we revisited column method. Please ensure your child continues to read lots at home and ask them questions about their reading.

Year 4

This week Year 4 continued to read and explore a book called 'The Name Jar'. We researched our own names to find their meanings and origins. We used this information to write non-chronological reports all about ourselves! At home, please read with your children and make sure they practise their times tables.

Year 6

The Year 6s at Hannah More have had a great week. On Monday's problem solving day, we solved mysteries and built wind turbines. Tuesday was fitness day and we took part in a range of healthy activities. We worked as a team on Wednesday's collaboration day and baked apple pie and shared family photos/possessions on Thursday's sharing day. Friday was a chance to reflect and celebrate our week together. At home, ask your children about the exciting activities they've been taking part in all week!
