

Important - Arrangements for September

From 2nd September all children should return to school. We will keep a 'bubble' system - each year group will be a bubble. For example, the children in year 4 will learn together, eat together and play together, with their teacher, LSA and their lunchtime staff members.

Because of our safety rules, parents will not be able to come into school for the time being. We hope to be able to welcome you back soon.

- Breakfast club will be open from 8-8.30am for children only; they should come through the office entrance. Each year group will have a separate table at breakfast club.
- The start of the day (for those children not coming to breakfast club) will be staggered. Families will be in either Group A or Group B. Group A should arrive at school between 8.40 and 8.55. Group B should arrive between 8.55 and 9.10. There will be one-way system, entering through the main gate and leaving via the gate in the ball court, onto Jubilee street. Staff will be there to guide you. Children will go straight to class when they arrive at school.
- Playtimes will be staggered, with each year group using a separate area of the playground.
- Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will have lunch between 11.45 and 12.45. Older year groups will have lunch between 12.45 and 1.45.
- The end of the day will also be staggered; Group A children will finish school at 3.00 and Group B children at 3.15. Please be prompt to collect your children at the end of the day.
- More 4 Kids will be open and you can book online as usual; we will contact you to advise you of the safety measures.

Final arrangements will be emailed to you in the last week of the holidays. We will also text you to tell you which group you are in.
