What I've learned this week...

Find your child's class below to read about what they have been learning this week and how you can help them

Reception

This week we learnt about Diwali and the story of Rama and Sita. We also compared the ways we celebrate in different cultures. The sounds we have been learning are P, I, N and also the number 3.

At home, please practise the sounds your children have been learning. Log on to their Independent Learning Diary as well. Please read lots over the holiday!

Year 1

We have been writing a Fact File on our important person; Princess Campbell. We enjoyed our class treat – which was marshmallows around the fire pit! At home, read with your child every day for 10 minutes. Practise adding numbers using the part-part-whole method.

Year 2

We have been using our acting and singing skills for our school performance. We created actions to help us remember the words and practised speaking loudly and clearly. We hope you enjoyed seeing our learning. At home, read with your child every night. Continue to practise the partitioning method over the holidays!

Year 3

We have been really busy practising and showing off our shadow puppet show. The children have also been working hard to make instruction booklets for how to make a shadow puppet! You can help at home by reading as often as possible with your child, encouraging them to go on times tables rock stars and asking them about their learning.

Year 4

As Authors and Historians, the children wrote non-chronological reports about the history of Bristol (using their knowledge learnt from local historian- Michael Gorely!) In maths we worked super hard to figure out subtraction with exchanges- the children have shown real perseverance in this tricky work and made their teachers so proud. At home, encourage your child to practise joining up their handwriting.

Year 5

We have been brilliant authors explaining to our audiences all about glass. As mathematicians we began exploring line graphs and had a go at drawing our own! We also explored the celebration of Diwali. At home, please practise adding and subtracting numbers, using the column method.

YEAR 6

Kestrel have been at IntoUniversity all week and are graduating today. Eagle learned to use the order of operations in maths and wrote non-chronological reports about beetles in English. At home, make sure your children rest and relax over the holidays and come back ready for another term of hard work. They should also continue using Times Table Rockstars to practise multiplication facts! Have a good break!
