# Year 2 -

This week we worked really hard at our assessments. We have seen loads of fantastic progress! In English we story-mapped a retelling of Anna Hibiscus. In Maths we honed our subtraction strategies. At home, help your child learn their number facts for addition and subtraction up to 20 off by heart. Please continue to encourage your child to read every day in a fluent voice.

This week we carried on looking at capacity in maths and explored our new story The Great Kapok Tree. We did a fantastic job describing one of the rainforest animals from the story! We also met our new teachers that we will have in Year 4. Please continue to learn the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. Please continue to encourage your child to read every day in a **fluent voice**.

This week we worked really hard on our end of year assessments. We also finished our book The City of Ember and practised reading charts and graphs as mathematicians. At home, read as often as possible with your child and ask them questions about what they are reading.

This week we went on two exciting trips: climbing and IntoUniversity. We learnt about the life cycle of bees and why bees are so important. In maths, we continued to consolidate our understanding of division and also completed a number of tests. At home please continue to practise times tables and spellings.
