LAVENDER

This week we read Burglar Bill and used Colourful Semantics to help us write sentences about the story. As mathematicians we learnt how to use tally charts and pictograms to represent data. At home please help your child practise counting by 5's.

This week really enjoyed reading Handa's Surprise and trying some fruits from the story! We then used adjectives to describe the fruits e.g. tangy, sweet, delicious. As mathematicians we practised adding groups together. At home can you try some fruits and describe how they taste?

This week we explored our book 'The Last Tree' and visualised what it would look like. We also used our senses to explore and describe the last tree in the story. In maths we practised counting in 10's, 2's and 5's to find the total of a group. As musicians we learnt about dynamics and pitch in music and practised these skills in our performance songs. At home practise your lines and the songs for our performance! Practise skip counting in 2's and 5's. Read every night with your child to help develop their fluency.

Year 2 This week we started reading our new story of the term, Zeraffa Giraffa. We enjoyed guessing what the story might be about using clues before reading the story together. In maths we continued learning about fractions. In history we had fun acting out John Cabot's life! Please read with your child every day and practise the 2, 3, 5, 10 times tables.

This week the children explored perimeter as mathematicians. They enjoyed sentence stacking in English lessons and all the adults were impressed with the writing they produced. We enjoyed learning about the Romans and had lots of fun using atlases to identify topographical features for settlements. Please help your child learn the 4 and 8 times tables. Please continue to encourage your child to read every day in a fluent voice.

As mathematicians we learned to add and subtract fractions including improper fractions and mixed numbers. As authors we spent the week writing a tension story using excellently detailed and descriptive sentences. In our enquiry we learnt about how sound travels through solids, liquid and gases into the ear. We have been learning our 9 times tables this week—please test your child on these at home over the weekend!

This week Year 5 had a busy week of trips! Monday was RE Day and we went to visit a church. On Tuesday we learnt about what University is like at LifeSkills. The children mastered decimals as mathematicians and got creative with their writing as authors. As historians we learnt about the Maya Empire!! At home please make sure to keep learning those spellings from your homework! Read every night for 15 minutes.

This week Year 6 enjoyed writing playscripts which they then acted out in order to help them edit and improve their work. As mathematicians they converted measurements e.g. meters to kilometres. As historians they learnt about democracy in Ancient Greece and compared this with today. They also learnt about the origins of the Olympic Games. At home please ensure your child completed the pages on converting measurements in their SATs books and read regularly.
