


We are delighted that we will be working with Circomedia from next term, offering afterschool workshops for different year group, starting with Year 3. Watch this space!

Do you have a child in Reception? If so why not join us for a family trip to the S.S. Great Britain on Wednesday 27th October. Buy tickets from Ruth on the gate next week, £2 per person, maximum 3 tickets per family. We will travel by ferry boat and there is a free workshop and free lunch!



Reception enjoyed learning the story of Goldilocks and making and tasting porridge. We had fun in our first 'forest explore' session collecting lots of leaves which we sorted in Maths. We also learnt about 'more' and 'fewer'. At home, practise the sounds in your sound book and reading the words with 'robot arms'. Can you collect some leaves or other natural objects and practise sorting? What do you have more or fewer of?

We have had a super busy week. We welcomed our student teacher Mr Williams to the team. He will be with us Tuesdays, Wednesday and Thursdays so make sure to say hello! We prepared for our hat walk next week and made lots of hats, following our designs. In maths we learnt about part whole models and used them to help us add. Please read with your child <u>5 times a week</u>. Practise counting forwards and backwards from 10. Practise writing numbers and letters correctly!

Year 2

This week we wrote letters inviting people to our performance! As mathematicians we looked at number bonds to 10 and 20. Please read with your child 5 times a week. Practise counting forwards and backwards from 100. Practise writing numbers too. Make sure you have our performance in your diary - it's Wednesday at 2.30!

This week we began to add and subtract number with exchanges! As authors we wrote the story of 'Leon and the Place Between' using amazing adjectives and different sentence openers to make our writing more interesting. We also made puppets for our puppet show. Please read with your child every day and practise your times tables.



This week as authors we have been showing off our knowledge about early Islamic civilisations and writing a non-chronological report. As mathematicians we have been practising column addition and as artists we have been creating our own Islamic art!

Please read with your child every day and practise the 6 times tables.

Year 5

Year 5 became experts at subtracting this week - we worked with numbers up to 1 million! As historians we went on a slavery trail and looked at important historical sites. We used different sources to research and discover information about Edward Colston. Please help your child with their homework spellings, ready for our weekly Monday test.

Kestrel class have been writing fantastic action stories and have started making a documentary about Charles Darwin. Eagle class have been doing lots of wonderful learning on World War 2 at IntoUniversity. Help your child with their

homework spellings ready for our weekly Tuesday test. Use Times Table Rockstars to practise tables up to 12x12. Make sure your child reads *every day!*
