

What have we been learning?

Reception.... We observed what is happening to the beans we planted. We drew and wrote about this in our 'Bean Diarys'. Ask your child about the different parts of the plant and what they think will happen next! At home, practise recognising numbers up to 20. Can you put the numbers in order to make a number line? Please add your learning to ILD (Interactive Learning Diary).

Year 1... This week we wrote our own diary entries as William from the Night Gardener. To do this we pretended to be William in different ways, and answered questions as William. At home, please practise counting in 2s 5s and 10s and ask about the Night Gardener.

Year 2... we started reading our book 'Zeraffa Giraffa' and wrote letters to the Pasha of Egypt to persuade him not to send the giraffe to Paris. As scientist we also explored the different habitats of animals living in the city. At home, please read with your child every day and practise spellings.

Year 5... in maths, we learned all about adding decimals together in different ways. In English, they learned the difference between writing in a formal style and in an informal style. In Enquiry, they created fact files about Bristol and one of Bristol's twin cities called 'Bordeaux' in France. At home, encourage your child to practise neat, joined up handwriting

Year 3... as mathematicians we have made our own clocks, ready to keep practicing how to tell the time. As scientists we have explored how different plants are adapted to live in different environments and as writers we have been writing our own versions of where the peach went from James and the Giant Peach. At home, keep encouraging children to tell the time and to read as often as possible and ask them questions about what they have read.

Year 4... well, this week has been very testing in year 4 but we have found plenty of time to learn AND have fun! We started a new enquiry on Monday and have been learning all about Vikings, Anglo-Saxons, Romans and Normans! We had another great swimming session and are looking forward to class treats next week! Please support at home by practising dividing by 100.

Year 6... The children are now experts on climate change and have written an explanation text about why our earth is changing as authors this week. As mathematicians, we have learnt how to measure and draw angles and are now moving onto reading and plotting coordinates! At home, make sure your child works on the test questions that we are sending home with them.
