

# What have we been learning?

Reception....We designed and built our own bug hotels this week. We wrote facts about minibeasts and clues to play 'Guess the minibeast' in phonics. We had a great time at Sports day too. As mathematicians we solved problems sharing fruit equally between the caterpillars. At home, practise sharing out toys or objects fairly between people in your family. Make sure everyone has an equal amount!

Year 1... We had a great time visiting Windmill\* Hill City Farm. We enjoyed picking fresh fruit and vegetables and having a tour of the farm. We enjoyed looking at all the different animals. We loved taking part in a cooking workshop where we used the ingredients we had picked to make some delicious snacks. In Maths we have been finding odd and even numbers. In English we have been writing recounts about our recent trip. At home, ask your child about the farm trip. What animals did they see?

Year 2...This week we had sports day and we all enjoyed doing the activities, joining in the races and cheering for our house! The following day in English we wrote a brilliant recount about what had happened. At home, please read as much as possible with your child over the holidays. Encourage children to practise their times tables as well!

Year 3... This week has been a very active week for the Year 3s! They've competed in two sports days and practisied their performance again and again to try and get it just right for today! Their teachers know how tired they are but are very proud of all their hard work. Help at home by reading with your child and encouraging them to practise their times tables.

Year 4... We are kicking off our next enquiry all about water by floating on it!! We've been on a boat this week which has been made entirely from plastic taken from the river Thames. We will be learning more about this next term. At home, practise your times tables (up to 12 x) in preparation for our times table test!



Year 5... In English, we wrote an information text about the St Paul's Carnival. In maths, we finished learning about different units of measure and in Enquiry, we continued to enjoy some carnival dance lessons! Year 5 also enjoyed a trip to Felix Road Adventure Park which they all loved! At home, please practise your joined up handwriting!

Year 6... This week we recounted our trip to bowling in our writing, using emotions and description. As mathematicians, we used key skills in investigations. There has also been lots of sports day fun-in-the-sun this week! Have a fantastic week off, you hard-working Year 6s! At home, please ask your child to write a story on any topic they like over the holidays. Next term year 6 will have swimming on Thursdays - please make sure they have their swimming kit ready.
