A busy week in Reception! We had great fun bringing in our teddies for our 'Teddy Bear Hospital' session. In phonics we practised capital letters. As mathematicians we learnt about circles and triangles, and used words such as **over, under, next to, behind and in front** to describe where something is. At home, play the teddy game. Can you follow the instructions to put the Teddy... under, on top of, behind a chair, table etc. Can you challenge your family and tell them where to put the bear?

This week Year 1 wrote some fantastic character descriptions to help Hoctopize find his missing toy Cuddles in our story 'Toys in Space'. In enquiry we made more toys and designed our book pages for our Toy Museum at the end of term. In maths we continued to learn about subtracting and finding the difference. At home please read the book in your bookbag everyday. Log into Bug Club and NumBots. Practise subtraction with numbers to 10 by counting back and using your fingers.

Year 2 had a busy week with assessments in reading, writing and maths. Their teachers are very proud of their effort. Towards the end of the week we looked at money as mathematicians and looked at instructions on how to make a jam sandwich! Please read with your child 5 times a week. Practise counting forwards and backwards from 100. Practise adding 2 digit and 2 digit numbers

This week Year 3 learnt their 2, 3, 4 and 5 times tables. As authors and geographers we explored volcanoes. We enjoyed making our own clay volcanoes and had a great time making them erupt. Please practise the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. Please continue to encourage your child to read every day in a fluent voice.

The Year 4 children worked so hard in all their tests this week. WE are really proud of how much focus they showed. In enquiry we focused on animals and their habitats and produced some inspiring posters to stop deforestation. In English they learnt to use paragraphs and in maths they multiplied by 10 and 100. They also impressed their swimming teachers during assessments. Help at home by practising 8 times tables and asking children about their assessments.

The Year 5 children worked so hard in all their tests this week as well as continuing to practise for their performance 'The Snow Queen' (14th Dec). We are really proud of the determination they showed! The Year 5 Mini-Police also really enjoyed seeing all the police equipment on Wednesday. Please help your child with multiplication tables and weekly spellings.

This week Year 6 focused on their presentation and handwriting.

We redrafted our action stories and the results have been absolutely fantastic! We made working heart models out of plastic bottles, straws and red coloured water. Very messy - but interesting and

informative! Please spot check your child's 6, 7, 8 and 9 times tables over the course of the week. Read with your child to check their fluency.
