Reception children got straight back into their learning this week. Well done to everyone for settling in to term 4! We will bring you more news about our learning next week. **What are you interested in? Find a book to share with your child in the Hub Library, open after school every Tuesday and Friday.**

This week we started our new book for the term 'The Last Tree'. We began to learn songs for our performance later this term and thought about the timbre of different instruments. In maths we began comparing numbers to 50. We enjoyed a lovely class treat making our own pizzas and some exciting World Book Day activities all about Burglar Bill! **At home practise counting forwards and backwards to 100. Read everyday and ask questions about the story to check your child understands it.**

Year 2

Year 2 had a fantastic school trip to SS Great Britain this week where we explored the ship and looked around the museum. We wrote a recount of our trip in English and we explored our new book 'Zeraffa Giraffa'. **Please read with your child 5 times a week, using Bug Club. Ask your teacher if you have forgotten your login. Practise your 2, 5 and 10 times table including doing them out of order.**

Year 3

This week we began reading our new book 'The Journal of Iliona' and are really looking forward to learning about the Romans! We sequenced the Roman Empire on a timeline in enquiry and listened to our story during a calm and comfy story time. As mathematicians we converted different units of measure and found equivalent amounts. We loved reading the story of Burglar Bill for World Book Day and designing a wanted poster for him! **Please make sure your child reads 5 times a week on Bug Club. Let us know if you need help logging in.**

Year 4

As mathematicians we continued to use equivalent fractions and learnt to use fractions greater than 1. As authors we planned and began to write tension stories. Our new enquiry is all about noise and sound—we learnt how sound travels and explored using different musical instruments. **At home please help your child practise the 7 times table - this is the hardest one!**

Year 5

This week we got straight back into our learning we will bring you more news about this term's enquiry and ways to help at home in next week's newsletter! **Please make sure you practise multiplication tables and weekly spellings.**



Please drop in to the Hub after school to borrow a book!

We had a fantastic first week back and the children enjoyed reading our new class text 'The Adventures of Odysseus'. The text links to this term's enquiry 'What made the Greeks great?'. For this we began using our geography skills to locate and describe Ancient Greece and made comparisons with Greece today. As mathematicians, we found the area of triangles and parallelograms. **At home please ensure your child completes the pages on area and perimeter in their SATs books. Read every day please!**
