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# This week's learning ... Reception

Reception have been enjoying the story of 'Goldilocks and the three bears'. In phonics we listened carefully to the first sounds in words and in maths we used our noticing skills to play the game '3 or not 3' We have also loved using our woodwork area! At home please make sure you are registered on Tapestry so you can see our home learning.



This week Year 3 produced brilliant writing when they retold the story of Rama and Sita. As mathematicians we practised column addition and as engineers we designed shadow puppets. Please read with your child every day and practise the 2, 5,3 and 4 times tables.

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This week year 5 were excited to welcome a visitor from Bristol Blue Glass as part of our enquiry. We used the column method to add and subtract, as well as writing engaging story openers using informal language techniques. At home, make sure you practise your times tables.

We have been very busy in year 1 Year 1 learning nouns and verbs. We have explored maps and direction, talking about left, right, North, South, East and West. In Maths we learnt some grown-up symbols that mean 'more than', 'less than' and 'equal to'. To see more learning, check the year 1 blog.

This week we have been busy making props and the stage for our performance! We have moved onto addition and subtraction in Maths and we are writing letters in English. ! Support your child's learning by reading with your child and practising lines with them for our upcoming performance



Year 4 finished reading Frogspell this week and then invented a sequel in groups. As mathematicians we learnt about negative number and Roman numerals. We have also been artists and created some wonderful Roman columns. Support your child's learning by reading with your child and encouraging them to practise times tables.



This week we learnt to use bar models to help us solve problems in maths. We discovered how authors build tension and suspense to write mystery stories. We completed our enquiry about adaptation and evolution by looking at beetles and banana trees. Support your child at home by practising written multiplication.
